Late last fall, Larry Berg and I replaced the dashboard in my TR6. I bought the dash from CG Autowoods (cgautowoods.com) I wanted a cherry veneer, not the usual walnut. They will use most any wood you want as long as they have a source for the veneer, and because I just happened to call the day before they were starting a TR6 batch in their shop, they charged me the regular price (\$250 + tax and shipping) rather than the custom price. Lucky.

As you can see from the pictures, the scariest part of this project was disconnecting all the gauges and switches, then getting them all back in the same place. The



dash itself is just held in by 5 screws, but to remove it completely you need to disconnect everything, which is a bit of a squeeze. Why they couldn't have made some of the wires an inch longer is beyond me.

The fit and finish on the new dash is excellent, should have done this years ago.

My name is Andy, and I'm a recovering Triumphaholic. My last Triumph escapade was on October 14, 2019, the day I sold TS58957L. Like many of my other Triumph days, it was not without incident.

First, October 14 was the day after Columbus Day, a day on which the potential Oregon buyer's bank was closed. Therefore, Joe hopped on the Columbus Day red-eye to MSP without a cashier's check. Pat Holt convinced me to take a personal check.

Second, after reading the snowfall totals for North Dakota and Montana, Joe had wisely decided to delay any driving trip back home until next spring with his wife. Pat found the last available winter slot for him at Quality Coaches.

Third, the TR3 wouldn't keep running for Joe. The first time we figured it was out of gas. Linda and Pat rescued us on 35E and put in a couple gallons of lawn mower gas. The second time, a few blocks from the non-oxy gas station, Pat and Linda brought us a few more gallons. We made it to the station and filled up the tank. It took much less than it should have if running on fumes. Then as we headed back to my house, the car sputtered and stopped again. Was something big time wrong? Joe loved the looks of the car and Pat had eloquently described its restoration and the capabilities of its mechanical restoration team (Greg Gelhar, John Kallaus, Joe De-Muth, Gary Stephenson and himself). Joe also enjoyed driving it when it was running. But I figured this latest malady made the sale shiny-side down.



Then a Coventry miracle. I saw that the key was slightly ajar in the ignition. The key fob was jiggling it when Joe shifted gears with his hand on top of the knob.
