How I Obtained My Third Triumph - Bill Nelson

After getting tired of driving my PTR Cruiser on outings with Southern California Triumph Owners Association (SCTOA) I mentioned at a meeting in 2017 that I was interested in a Triumph to be able to drive in Southern California. A few days later I was given a name and phone number of a person who used to be a member and was being forced to sell. Her first car, a 1971 TR6. I looked at the car and paid for it on Friday March 13. On the way to the bank, I asked the seller (Kathee) if she would like to be a navigator in the TR6 during a SCTOA drive. She said she would like that.

While the AAA driver was loading the car onto the flatbed, he commented that she looked like she was about to cry. I told him about it being her first car and a daily driver and yes, she was sad to see it go.

A few months later I asked Kathee if she would like to go out to dinner. She ended up with the car and the guy, I ended up with the car and the girl.

A Fresh Year

Last year in one of my "Season of..." stories, I listed a host of things I was going to do to Gulf 4 (our TR4). The list was long but the items that got checked off was short. I will say in my defense a few things got in the way.

My sister dragged home an early Miata that had close to 200,000 miles on it. The water pump was noisy and there was no history with the car so I did the timing belt, idler pullies, cam seals, valve cover gaskets, and radiator too. The

top was shot so I attacked that too! Makes fitting a TR top child's play.

I also spent a fair amount of time helping Larry Sanderson getting his TR4A back together after final paint was done at a paint shop near him. It will return in the spring for a bit more work but for now the shop is all mine.

I did replace the steering rack in our car in preparation for the trip west to the Black Hills and while doing that, found some cracks in the frame. I welded them up as best I could in situ, but I knew then that the body needed to come off to do a proper repair and make a complete inspection possible. I believe I cracked the frame while trying to



install a nicer looking cross member between the suspension towers a while back that was a bit longer that the original. I used some hydraulic assistance to get it in but in the end didn't get it to go. I guess that proves the same part will not always fit one car to the next.



I am sure glad I decided to do the tear down! This car has always had an inordinate number of rattles and I just attributed it to the car being old. Well, the reasons were many. There were several mounting bolts missing and or broken holding the body to the frame. There were also several body mount pads that didn't fill the gap between the frame and the body. The combination of these things allowed the body to move about a bit on the frame, enough that in multiple places there were bright metal wear spots.

Complete tear down is now complete and I have some good news and some bad. The good news is I didn't find any more cracks in the frame, the bad news is I found rust through on the driver's floor under some half-adhered sound insulation and bondo filled rust holes in numerous locations. More on that in another article. I sand blasted the frame and since it was stripped bare, decided to do a Racetoration lite reen-

forcing of the frame. Chip Lederer is using several components they sell and did the full-on "Rallye" reenforcing and when he is done he will be able to do jumps without fear of bending the frame! I did the areas I thought may in the future be weakened by rust inside the frame. It is day 28 of the rebuild and the frame is painted and ready for some

restored components to be attached. I don't have a clear path as to the order I will take at this point in the rebuild! I guess we will all know after next month's letter.





