
### The Countdown Has Begun

### Tech Session - Jeff Johnson

At our July 17 Tech Session 5 club members gathered at Daniel Silverman's garage to replace the water pump in his 1970 TR6. The bearings in the water pump were making a lot of noise and it probably was ready to spring a leak. We got the new water pump installed with help of some lock-tight since we had no new lock washers. We also looked at the lighting which all seemed to work except for an intermittent emergency flasher switch. Since the running lights were somewhat dim and the signal lights caused the running lights to flicker, we recommended the ground contacts on the light sockets and the light housings be cleaned up for a better ground to the chassis. Daniel took the car for a short road test and the water pump passed the test.

#### August 28 details:

On August 28 a multi-stop tour will take you over approximately 60 miles of county side roads. The tour starts at Oak Park Height River Crossing Park located at 1525 60th street, Oak Park Heights, MN. This is next to the Club Tara Hideaway Restaurant (south side of highway 61) The drive takes about 2 hours (with regathering and a stop at the Bass Lake Cheese Shop) so if we want to make a noonish lunchtime we need to plan on leaving the park at 10:00am. You will travel south to cross the St. Croix River at Hudson and briefly stop at the Octagon House. The next twelve miles will provide tree covered rustic road driving with plenty of twists that should make you smile!!!. The Bass Lake Cheese Factory is an example of the small production facilities that used to dot the Wisconsin countryside. From here we'll drive north through the town of Somerset and head toward the St. Croix County line passing over the Apple River dam sluice and the onto the Rice Lake Flats. There will be a few spots with great views of the river along. On 40th street watch out for the cattle crossing. Changing direction eastward, we will head toward Star Prairie but take a shortcut past Cedar Lake Speedway (the winged cars will be running at 5:00 pm). You will be just about twelve miles from the 45th Parallel Distillery and Lift Bridge Brewery at this point. The distillery has both beverages, food and tours. The Brewery has tours and tastings. They both have websites if you wish to check them out beforehand. If you wish to do a tour or tasting it is advised you book that on-line ahead of time. They do fill up. After we relax for a bit, It's about a 20 minute drive back to Stillwater. This puts you back where you started and ends your tour with a drive across the new St. Croix Crossing Bridge. Detailed directions will be pro-
