Kastner Cup Gets the Main Stage

It was recently announced that the Kastner Cup will be at Road America July 14-16, 2023 as part of the Weathertech International Challenge (WIC) with Brian Redman. If you follow vintage racing at all you will realize this is a real big deal for the whole Triumph community. The WIC is one of the largest vintage races in the country, and that is for two reasons. One is that Road America is one of the top race tracks in the country and on the bucket list of many if not most race car drivers. The second is the location is such that it will draw a large number of cars from the east and west coasts. To put it into a sports analogy, it would be the equivalent to being the halftime show at the Superbowl. Center stage for 30 minutes at the best venue in front of the biggest crowd of the year.

Most vintage racers are car lovers like us with a limited budget so they don't just call the crew to show up and fly in to do the driving. Yes, there are some that have the cash to do that but many maintain their cars and tow them to the track with a pick-up full of tools and spares. There are



several racers that are part of the local InterMarque group and their prepared cars will be featured at next years Spring Kick-off in Osseo. One of my favorite things to do at the races is walk through the pits and look at the cars close-up. This is not like the Indy 500 where you need credentials to get pit access. One ticket gets you full access to the whole venue. Bring a lawn chair though as some of the best track viewing is under the shade of the big oak trees that surround the track.



For those that are newer to our club, Kas Kastner was a pioneer in transforming road-going Triumphs into race cars that beat many cars that it shouldn't have. In 1969 the Group 44 cars won 44 of the 70 entered and never finished below 3rd. He was a brilliant engineer and a fearless driver. After leaving Triumph, Kas went on to manage the Nissan IMSA GTP team and with them won the manufacturers' championship three years in a row. The Kastner Cup was created to honor him and this year's running was the 20th year.

I attended Kastner Cup Races at Road Atlanta-2012, Blackhawk Farms-2017, and Portland International Raceway-2021, and I am very excited to be there next year to witness maybe the most Triumphs on the grid at one time. I have heard from organizers that the TR 250K built by Kas Kastner with body designed by Peter Brock will be there along with a couple of cars from the UK. I looked at hotel prices for the weekend and they are through the roof for anything close to the track so you may want to look 30 minutes away for better rates. There is usually a track touring time offered over the lunch break for a fee so if you want to see and feel what it would be like to be on track at over 100 MPH coming down hill into turn 5 start planning now.

It was a hot one but a group of 20 cars showed up from our club for this event. Weather was good until the trip home for some as rain moved in causing some to hunker down at a gas station or under an overpass.

Mini Tech Session - Christina Bigelow



Reggie and I did a mini tech session on my Spitfire replacing my ignition switch/key on my steering column, replacing the turn signal/horn/bright switch.

First we removed the seat and the old key is lying on the floor. The next photo is Reggie trying to get a "seat" in the screws to reverse them out.

Next shots are what tool ultimately worked including box they came in. Screws backed out easily. First photo of the bits in his hand did not work - he just couldn't get a bite in it, had to use the left hand screw bits to chatter it out.

Then he's taking out the "set" screws on the ignition and the ones that came with my new ignition (from Rimmer Bros) did not fit the new ignition OR the old switch.

So then we searched through cans of hardware (my husband's) and various screw drawers and found some little ones that worked. They were too long so we had to cut them off to make them work as the new set screws.

There's a photo of the old and the new ignition and we just left the black/green wire which was attached to that clip you can see on the old one tucked up in the dash with the new ignition. We traced it to a little metal cylinder next to the battery.

While Reggie was working on the set screws, I disassembled the windshield wiper (right side of column) switch/arm off of the left/turn signal arm (the old one is the broken black one). The blue middle cuff/ cylinder is the new turn signal arm reconnected with the windshield wiper arm.

And finally, Reggie putting the set screws in the new ignition. Turns out we put it back together and once the steering wheel was on, the left and right switch arms were loose and wonky because I FOR-GOT to tighten the cuff - because the old one slid right off (because it was broken) so i didn't even notice there was a tightening screw! So then we had to take apart the cowl (this was a pain - the little brass fittings that the long screws (which come up through the bottom cowl) have to screw into, kept falling out). Finally, had to put little pieces of paper in the holes with the brass fittings to get them to stay in. Then we were able to screw the cowls together again (for the umpteenth time) and then the steering wheel went back on. THEN realized the left arm came from Rimmer Bros slightly bent forward so my left hand would get hit by it when my hand was on the steering wheel. AND I couldn't dip my headlights (flash someone) because there wasn't room to pull the arm toward me. So Reggie then bent it slightly. And voilá, it worked.

Finally, I popped the new emblem in as I was driving (terribly safe) in the hot sun on Monday and it went in easily!

So it's all back together and working great. Thanks to Reggie! It was all ready for Rivertown Days.







Tech Session - Jill Davenport


The July tech session was held to address a few issues with my '75 Spitfire. Nine, count them, nine(!) generous club members showed up on this summer Saturday morning to help. Two teams of two started on the rear brakes – new cylinders and shoes. There were some grunts and exclamations and a few different tools tried, but the shoe springs were finagled into place. Another team of two started with the lack of horn problem. After diagnostics, it was determined that a horn relay and horn push brush were needed. Someone else cleaned and lubricated the seat slides and made the seat more adjustable. The trip odometer was freed and works. The starting problem may be improved by the discovery that the air filter housing had been put in backwards along the way somewhere, and the holes had been covered. The tires were swapped back to front to try to further diagnose the shimmy problem. And not even on the list, Greg Gelhar pulled a tool out of his mechanics shop van and replaced a missing snap on the convertible top cover. There was also an auxiliary tech session in the driveway – brake bleeding. All in all, an excellent tech session for which I am very grateful. Jill Davenport
