
because the VTR has a rule that the following year's event cannot be announced before the upcoming event is over.



Glenn's 1955 TR2 restoration

In the summer of 2017 I took my 1955 TR2 to a guy who was 'recommended' to me to do the body and paint work on my car. His original timeline for completion was six months. After he had the car for almost two years I realized he seemed to have stalled out and not making any progress, much of what he had done was of questionable quality, and I sensed he might be getting ready to quit the project.

Around this time I found another guy who said he was willing to complete the project so the body was moved from the south Minneapolis garage/ shop to the new guy's shop in Lakeville. The second guy worked part-time out of this shop and normally worked on muscle cars but he thought working on a Triumph might be a fun change. At that same time I brought the chassis to my house so I could work on it with the body off before also moving it to the Lakeville shop.

The second guy had a tendency to over promise and under deliver, including missing two promised completion deadlines of April 1, 2022 and March 31, 2023. In March 2023 Chip Lederer and I drove to the



Lakeville shop to check on the progress (or lack of progress). Chip and I had a discussion and after four years it was clear at the rate this guy was going it might be another 30 years before he was finished with the car.

That day Chip reached out to Bob Lee and we drove to





Bob's house and talked to him about taking on my car and finishing it up. In April 2023 the guy who had been working on my car in Lakeville

delivered the car to Bob's shop for him to complete. Over the next ten months Bob has worked to turn my dream into reality (and fixing a lot of mistakes, primarily the first guy, but also the second guy who worked on the car). It was amazing to watch the progress Bob, and later with Bob Jr's help, was making on the car.

In September 2023 it was decided before the body was reattached to the frame it would be a good time to start the engine that had been rebuilt by Larry

Berg years prior. The engine turned over a few times, fired up, and it ran great. (This 'start-up' session was covered in the October newsletter).

On Friday, March 1st Bob and Bob Jr. delivered the car to my house and Bob drove the car off the trailer and up my driveway and it is now back in my garage for the first time in nearly seven years. This was also the first time the car has moved under its own power since 1979.

I still have a lot to do to finish the car up including the interior, top, side curtains, and sorting a few things out so it's running (and stopping) properly, but the most important thing is it's back home again!!!





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August Tech Session: Glenn's TR2

On Saturday, August 10th I hosted a tech session to work on my TR2, with the goal of fixing a pesky, but significant, oil leak coming from connection for the oil pressure line at the oil filter housing, and to install a new convertible top. With the team that included Dave Heglund, Joe DeMuth (working with an injured finger), Larry Berg, Daniel Buchen, and Greg Thomson the tech session was a complete success.

Work began on the oil leak by disassembling the oil pressure line connection that consists of an

inner copper compression washer, a banjo connection, an outer copper compression washer, and a cap nut. Close inspection showed it appeared the oil leak was coming from between the oil filer housing and the banjo unit.

These pieces had previously been disassembled and reassembled 3-4 times without successfully fixing the oil leak, so the going-in theory was the source of the leak might be coming from the aluminum oil filter housing itself. A replacement housing was on-hand in case it was needed.

After the cap nut, banjo, and washers were removed, a close inspection showed there appeared to be a small scratch in the aluminum oil filter housing. At this point the oil filer housing was removed with the intent of swapping that housing with the spare housing. Once the existing housing



was removed, Larry Berg stepped in and using a file he gently filed out the scratch on the housing and made the surface smooth again. The original housing was reinstalled, and the washers, banjo, and cap nut were reassembled. With the now smooth housing surface, the oil leak issue was successfully resolved!

While the oil leak work was being done, another group was working on the top of the car installing the new cloth convertible top. Installing a new top is a very slow process requiring lots of precise measurements, fittings, and adjustments. One step is to ensure the straps on the convertible frame are installed and adjusted properly, including the straps being fitted equally on both sides, to allow for the top to lay on the frame bows correctly and snug.

The other step in the process is to fit the convertible top to the frame and car. Once again this requires multiple measurements and fittings to ensure the top lays properly. For this, a separate worktable was set up. The crew laid the top over the frame on the car multiple times, and one by one the location for each of the lift-a-dot (on the car and the lift-a-dot or Tenax fastener were attached. This process was repeated multiple times for each stud until the top



was completely fitted to all of the lift-a-dot and Tenax studs on the car and windshield frame. The end result of this process resulted in a beautiful convertible top!

body) or Tenax (along the top of the windshield) fastener studs were identified and marked on the top.

As each of the stud locations were identified on top, the top was carried to the worktable, a hole was punched through the top,

Friday morning I was getting ready to meet Orrin for breakfast downstairs in the hotel to make our plans to go watch the funkhana, autocross and the LeMans start events scheduled for that day. No wallet. I can't find my wallet in the room.



Tech Sessions - Frank Weber

Tech sessions are a great way to learn about your car or get help with your Triumph project. They can be anything from sharing specialized techniques to help learning how to tune up a Triumph to extra hands separating a car's body from the frame.
